Our God is a God of miracles: The Bible Is Full of Miracles

- Moses parts the Red Sea (Exodus 14:21-31).
- Elisha, a human like us, prays and controls the rain (James 5:17).
- Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego survive a deadly fire (Daniel 3:16-28).
- Mana falls from heaven to feed the Israelites (Exodus 16:1-36).

In fact, there are over 150 documented miracles in the Bible.

It's clear we serve a God of miracles. So why are we often hesitant to ask for a miracle in our own lives?

Perhaps it's because we don't know how to ask.

God not only provides documented miracles in His word,

He also instructs us on how to ask for and receive these blessings in our lives.

Instructions for a miracle:

- When you pray and ask for something, believe that you have received it, and you will be given whatever you ask for (Mark 11:24).
- Ask and you shall receive... (Matthew 7:7)
- If you have the faith of a mustard seed... (Matthew 17:20-21 & similarly Luke 17:6).

God Wants to Perform Miracles In Your Life

All you have to do is believe and ask; if it is His will, it will be accomplished!
